WORK

Ms Driessen-Reilly started her career as a general practice Solicitor in Dublin and then as a Solicitor/Advocate in Brussels. In 2001 she joined the College of Europe (Development Office) in Bruges as a legal researcher. Between 2003-2006 she worked for the European Commission, DG Information Society, as a Legal Officer dealing with contractual, IPR and institutional law issues. In the periods 2006- 2014 and then 2017 - 2022 she held the position of principal administrator at the European Commission, DG Competition, where she was responsible for numerous cases notified under the EU merger regulation and infringements of Article 101 TFEU, including settlement of cartel cases.

In 2015 - 2017 she focused on providing legal advice and consultancy in the area of EU competition law as a Solicitor/Advocate at Holmes Kirby in Brussels. In 2016 she was appointed as additional member of an Arbitral Tribunal in an international dispute administered by the London Court of International Arbitration, London.

Since 2022 Ms Driessen-Reilly is a Legal Advisor at the European Economic and Social Committee in Brussels, dealing with EU institutional law, including settlement of contentious issues.

In 2021 she became Vice Chair of the Institute of International and European Affairs (IIEA) Brussels AISBL, and has held the position of Chair since 2022.
